## **Laurel Signs Articulation Agreement with Thiel**



On November 2, Thiel College Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs Greg Q. Butcher, Ph.D. and Laurel Institutes Executive Vice President Doug Decker, Ph.D. signed an agreement that would provide a pathway for Laurel graduates to complete a bachelor's degree.



# Laurel Technical Institute Hosts Grand Opening for Commercial Kitchen at Sharon Campus



"Funding from the City of Sharon was a catalyst for us being able to do this,' said Doug Decker, VP of Laurel Technical Institute, referencing the ARPA funds that were committed to the project. "That investment will multiply and be reinvested with real business startups that become part of the economic development of the city.

Created in the style of Fulton Commons in Pittsburgh and Commonwealth Kitchen in Youngstown, OH, the commercial kitchen project opens the culinary location for public rentals with the shared space, including two kitchen spaces, the Gigi's Table restaurant space and in early 2023 it will also include commercial walk-in coolers and freezer space with the full-blown kitchen incubator completely set up by next spring. The rentable space could be used for small graduation parties, showers, funeral meals,

or food trucks that need a place for a brick & mortar event, among other ideas.

"The idea is to ultimately build concepts that can be expanded or replicated into the City of Sharon and surrounding areas,' said Decker, referencing aspiring food entrepreneurs, those with a restaurant concept they want to try out and those that bake at home who want to take their wares commercial. "Say a home entrepreneur has a great sauce that they want to can and produce to sell to the public. Now you have a place to do this that doesn't break the bank and you can test the concept with low risk as well as being surrounded by an eco-system of support.'

The eco-system Decker references is the culinary school that opened in Fall 2020 that is already located in the Sharon campus. The school, which encompasses the kitchen and restaurant space as well as a community garden and shared greenhouse with Whole Life Services in Hermitage, has already graduated 6 students and currently has its highest enrollment since it opened at close to 20. "We also foresee graduates of our programs developing their own culinary concepts out of this kitchen space," Decker said, adding that the school currently

offers lunch to the public during set times throughout the semester.

Expectations for the commercial kitchen include a food-related business spinning out of the kitchen incubator every year, then two and three, with the goal to have incubated ten culinary businesses into the community and region at the end of 5 years. "It's ambitious but I think also reasonable," explained Decker "If we give people a place to start and a culinary community to be a part of, who knows what can happen when the momentum grows.

Currently the culinary program has created internships with the local business community including Vey's Pub & Grille, Hermitage; The Springfield Group; J Hicks in Mercer; Avalon Country Club and most recently Nemacolin Resort in southwestern PA and Woodland Cellars in Hubbard, OH. "The culinary program has really taken off in the past six months as industries have reopened," Decker said, adding that their goal with the culinary program and the kitchen incubator is to "really focus on standing it up so it can also help support graduates of the culinary program as well as the community."
